The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to define a working relationship between Montgomery College (hereafter referred to as MC) and Educacion Profesional Intermedio (hereafter referred to as EPI) established at Venusstraat # 3, Oranjestad, Aruba whereby the two institutions agree to examine possible faculty and student exchanges within the academic area of cybersecurity.

Participants

Montgomery College

- Largest community college in the state of Maryland
- Serves 50,000 students on three campuses (Germantown, Rockville, Takoma Park/Silver Spring)
- Is highly diverse, ethnically and culturally, with students from 170 countries
- Offers over 100 degree and certificate programs, across many areas which include biosciences, health sciences, engineering, information technology, hospitality management and technical trades
- Prepares students to successfully transfer to four-year colleges/universities or enter the workforce

Educacion Profesional Intermedio

- Public institution offering post-secondary education on Aruba.
- Serving 1,900 students from Aruba and internationally
- Organized in 4 units (schools) Economic, Science and Technology, Hospitality & Tourism, Healthcare.
- Offers 14 programs at levels 3, 4 and 5 in accordance with the European Qualifications Framework.
- Prepares student for the local and international workforce as well as successful transfer to higher education in the Netherlands, U.S.A. and Canada

Goal and Focus

The goal of the relationship between MC and EPI is to create new collaborations which:

- Are mutually beneficial for MC and EPI
- Create opportunities for students and faculty at both institutions to learn from counterparts
- Enhance MC's and Montgomery County's international presence and reputation
- Provide EPI with consulting on increasing the availability of online content
- Create opportunities for EPI to learn about the curriculum development process at MC
- Evaluate curriculum content, methods of delivery, instructor qualifications, hardware and software requirements.

Initial academic areas of focus will include, but not be limited to:

• Subject areas: Cybersecurity, Hospitality, Business

Partnership opportunities for MC and EPI to be pursued will include, but not be limited to:

- Provide exchange and semester abroad programs for students, faculty and/or administrators of both MC and EPI
- Other collaboration opportunities as defined and agreed to by MC and EPI

Roles and Commitments

Montgomery College and EPI will:

- Devote the resources necessary to ensure the success of resulting collaborations
- Assist with relationship development/enhancement with new collaborators, as requested
- Shall not enter into any commitment or incur any debt on behalf of the other.

This MOU is:

- Effective when signed by the parties, shall remain in effect for five years, and may be extended by mutual written agreement
- · Cancellable by either party by informing the other party in writing
- Without obligation and not binding or legally enforceable, imposes no enforceable obligations upon the parties, and does not grant any rights
- Nonexclusive and both parties are free to have other arrangements and collaboration with other parties in the academic area of cybersecurity.
