



SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS:

Undergraduate international student applicants are automatically considered for University merit-based awards following acceptance to CCU.

Merit awards range from \$6,000 to \$11,000 per year based on English language proficiency scores or test scores and high school grades/marks.

Transfer International Scholarships range from \$4,000 to \$6,000 each year.

SISTER-STATE AGREEMENTS/SPECIAL TUITION PRICE

Residents of the following are provided a special tuition rate, with a tuition savings of \$13,790 USD for 2015-2016. This special tuition rate is afforded to residents as long as they prove their residency and their country/constituent remains a sister-state of South Carolina. Recipients of the sister-state special tuition price are ineligible from receiving merit-based scholarships.

GRADUATE STUDENTS:

Many graduate assistantships are available to help talented graduate students lower the cost of their attendance. Those receiving full-time graduate assistantships (20 hr. week) pay the in-state tuition rate and receive \$6,500 per semester. Those receiving half time graduate assistantships (10 hr. week) receive \$3,250 per semester.

RESIDENCE HALLS

Coastal Carolina University requires all first- and second-year students (full-time, degree-seeking students under the age of 21) to live in campus residential communities. Living in campus housing is part of the foundation of a successful college career. Students who live on campus have better GPAs, are more involved in campus activities and are more likely to take advantage of emotional and academic support as they settle into their new home away from home.

CCU's 10 residential communities house approximately 4,200 students on campus. Each community features a bed, closet, dresser, desk and chair for each student. Some floorplans have shared kitchen areas, and all residence halls feature shared lounge areas for students to meet and build friendships. Full-time professional community coordinators live in each residential community, and highly-trained student staff or residential assistants are key resources for the students living on campus. In addition, international students should consider living in our Intercultural Experience Community, in which Americans and international students live and share their cultures together. 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FRESHMAN ADMISSIONS:

INTERNATIONAL FRESHMEN: Students currently enrolled or graduated from secondary/high school (without University credits earned after graduation from post-secondary school).

Applicants (citizens) from countries other than the United States must demonstrate completion of secondary school in their home country by the time of enrollment at CCU (comparable to completion of senior high school in the United States). Students should demonstrate an average grade of B or above (80 percent or above) to be a strong candidate for admission. If your first language is not English, you will also need to satisfy CCU's English proficiency requirement. It is permissible for you to apply to CCU while your final year of secondary school is in progress.

TRANSFER ADMISSIONS:

INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER: Students with earned University credit after secondary/high school graduation or currently enrolled in a University.


Transfer applicants who demonstrate 24 transferable credits and a cumulative GPA of 2.0 meet admissions to CCU.

If you have previously attended (or are now attending) another post-secondary institution outside the USA, you must submit, along with your official transcripts, a course-by-course credential evaluation by an accredited member of the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES). Your credits from your foreign institution will be evaluated after you have confirmed your \$100 enrollment.

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION:

If English proficiency requirement is not met, students can be awarded conditional admission. These decisions are made based on a review of the complete file submitted for admission through CCU. These students would then be referred to CCU's intensive English program offered through ELS Myrtle Beach before matriculating as a student at CCU. *IF your first language is English, you are not required to submit an English proficiency test; however, you are required to submit the SAT or ACT test.
