Qualifications Valued Around the World

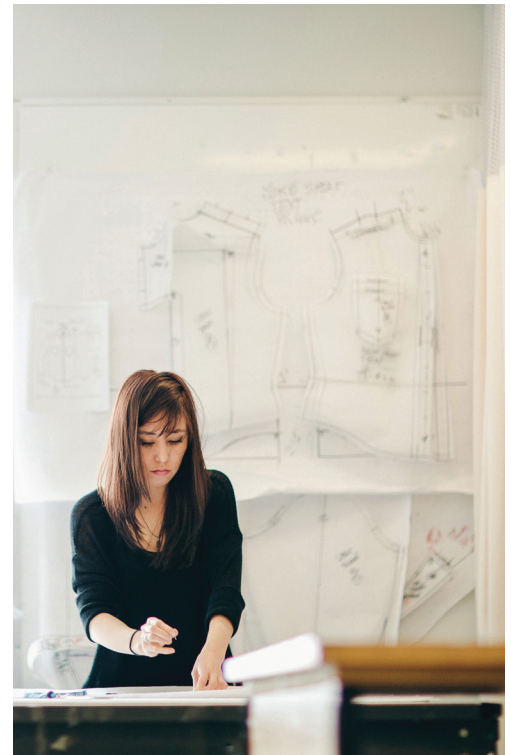

Work While You Study in Canada

As an international student you are eligible to work up to a maximum of 20 hours per week while you study full-time in Canada.

Work After Graduation

Upon completion of your program you may be eligible for a work permit to work up to a maximum of 3 years after graduation. This Canadian experience will be a great step towards a good career back in Aruba.
